Notes

Linda opened the meeting. She shared the purpose of the meeting was for the public to hear from the recently selected design team, TranSystems, on their background and qualifications. Linda introduced Ed Whatley, from Owner's Representative firm CGL. Ed referenced the work completed to date on the project and introduced TranSystems. Ed explained how TranSystems would work with CGL and the county on the next phase of the project. Brian Endler from TranSystems shared information about their firm's relevant experience with correctional projects. He also explained the makeup of their team and highlighted their sub-contractor, HDR, who will provide the team with insights in mental and medical health given their vast experience on the subject in correctional facilities. He shared TranSystems' work on a number of projects within Pennsylvania and other areas of the US.

Linda then opened up the meeting for public comment. Seven individuals spoke and addressed the following issues:

Needs Assessment

Individuals spoke about reducing the number of beds projected for the new facility as indicated by the Needs Assessment. They suggested reducing the number of beds would reduce the burden on the tax payer and county for not only the cost to build the facility, but also to maintain and staff it. Areas those speaking felt should be addressed:

- Re-activate the working group of justice staff and non-profits to prepare a plan in parallel with the design of the facility to reduce the population and reduce the number of days in the facility for those awaiting trial.
- Engage rehabilitative services to work inside the jail to prepare those who are leaving the facility with the tools they need to be productive members of society and reduce recidivism. They emphasized the new facility should have space for those activities to occur.
- Utilize Alternatives to Violence Project as a resource for assisting those to transition into the community.
- Work with the judicial system to reduce the time of stay for those awaiting trial in the facility. This would allow those individuals to retain their job and support their families and themselves while awaiting trial, and they suggested it would save the county money if their stay inside the facility was reduced.



Mental and Behavioral Health Services

Individuals spoke about the emphasis on mental and behavioral health services for the new facility. Comments included:

- The new facility should have a special housing unit for those impacted by mental health issues with an emphasis on therapeutic facilities.
- The new facility should not be the defacto county location for individuals with a mental health crisis. If a person suffers with mental health issues, they should be in the facility because they have committed a crime—not be placed there if they have mental health issues.
- The new facility should have space to conduct drug and alcohol programs for the detainees.
- Utilize the Friends of Quaker for a resource on programs inside the facility.

Existing Facility

An individual spoke about the opportunities for repurposing the existing facility. Questions posed included:

- Is there a committee or someone inside the county looking at what to do with the existing facility?
- Could the facility be used to serve the unhoused population, or housing in some capacity for those of lower income levels?

Additional Comments

An individual living near the new site requested the design focus on the lighting and how it may impact the wildlife in the area.

Quote from public commentary: As we invest in building a modern facility, we should also create a modern judicial system to go along with it.
